## 2004 – 4th Street Community Update

The 2004 - 4<sup>th</sup> Street development team is committed to providing the public and stakeholders with project updates. The following is a brief summary for the month of September.

- The site continues to be maintained on a daily basis with daytime supervision and after-hours security.
- Fencing is being monitored to protect pedestrian and vehicular traffic.
- Construction site conditions are being monitored for safety.
- In cooperation with the **Alberta Advanced Education and Technology, Apprenticeship and Industry Training Program**, Strategic Group and Morwest Crane are providing the 4th Street site and crane for crane operator testing. This crane operator testing will take place at various times through the month of September and it will be conducted during regular business hours.

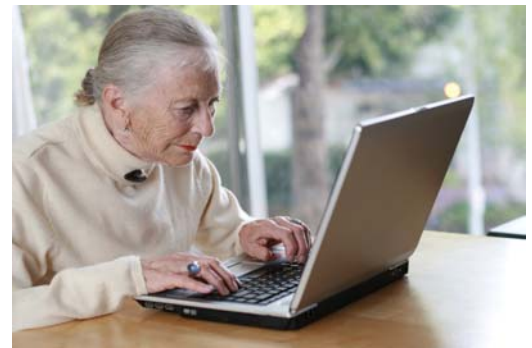
